

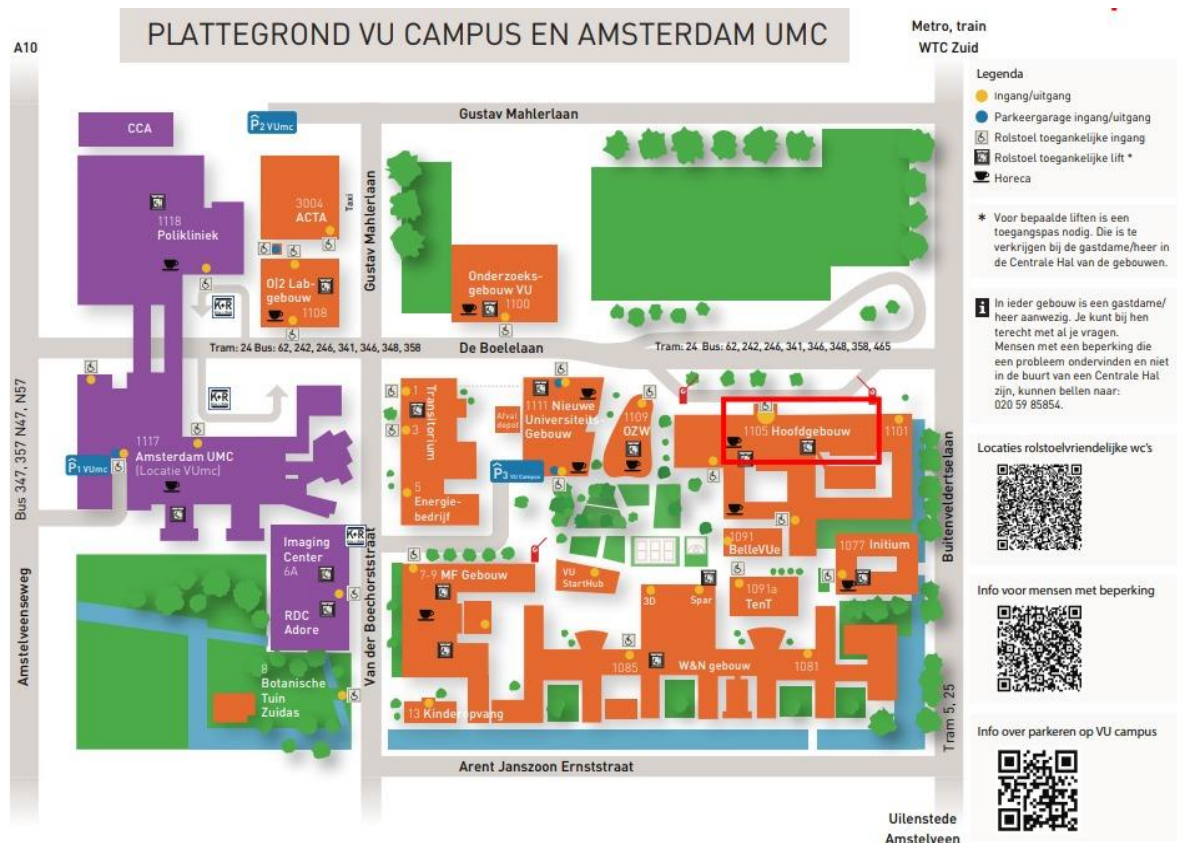
Practical Information

Venue

PT-AI 2025 takes place on the main campus of VU Amsterdam. The campus can be reached via the station 'Amsterdam Zuid' (trains and metro with about 5 minutes to walk to the main building) as well as via the stop 'Boelelaan/VU' or 'A.J. Ernststraat' (tram and bus directly next to the main building).

The first keynote takes place in **HG12A-00**, located in the main building of the main campus. When entering the main building, you walk left to the elevators. There you can either take the stairs or an elevator to the 12th floor. The rooms are signposted from the entrance, and don't hesitate to ask for help.

If you cannot find the venue, there is always an employee at the entrance of the main building who will be happy to help you find the room.

Presentations

Each talk is scheduled for 30 minutes, including presentation and Q&A. We recommend a talk of roughly 20 minutes, leaving enough time for discussion.

Presentations will take place via the local media system. Ideally, bring your own computer (HDMI/USB-C, adapter will be available) or send your slides to your chair before your presentation, and communicate to them how you would like to present.

Lunch and Dinner(s)

Coffee/tea in the breaks is centrally organized at the conference venue. Lunch and dinner are self-organized. There will be a reception on Thursday with a Dutch "borrel".

For lunch, there are plenty of options available on and around campus, including the university canteen located in the basement and the supermarket "Spar" situated just outside the main building. Breaks are long enough to walk towards the Zuid Station (where you most likely arrived).

We recommend Market 33 and 7even, which are both on Claude Debyssyalaan. There are many more options.

For dinner, there are plenty of options on the way to the Zuid station (there are too many to list here, and Google "knows" them all),

But we recommend exploring our beautiful Amsterdam. Avoid the city center and rather go to De Pijp, Jordaan, Oost, or the Vondelpark area. A favorite restaurant of ours is this: <https://anjappar.nl>, which is located near the Reichsmuseum. Many restaurants require reservations, but they might be easy to get online at relatively short notice.
